BIO: Abel Adames started his pro career in 2017 with the DSL Giants appearing in 26 games with a 4-0 record in 37.2 IP, 1.67 ERA, five holds, three saves in five opportunities, allowed 24 hits, 12 R, 7 ER, 26 walks, struckout 33 batters and the opposition hit .180 against him. In 2018, he moved to the AZL Giants and made 14 appearances, 16.1 IP with a 6.06 ERA, three holds, permitting 15 hits, 14 R, 11 ER, 18 walks, nine strikeouts and a .254 batting average against. In 2019, he was promoted to short season Salem-Keizer where he appeared in 16 games, record a 2-0 record, 22 IP with a 6.55 ERA, one hold, allowing 25 hits, 20 R, 16 ER, 12 walks, 22 strikeouts and the opposition hit .281. Last season, in Low-A San Jose he made 17 relief appearances where he would post a 3-0 record, 30.1 IP with a 3.86 ERA, one hold, allowing 29 hits, 15 R, 13 ER, 17 walks, 37 strikeouts and a .252 batting average against. Overall, Adames' career numbers have been solid, especially his 9-0 record. He's pitched in 77 games, 109.1 IP with a 4.28 ERA, 10 holds, three saves in five save opportunities, permitting 97 hits, 66 R, 52 ER, 81 walks, 107 strikeouts and a lifetime batting average against of .237.

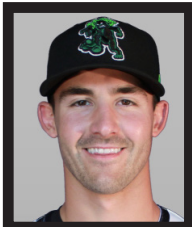

During his time with the Wild Things, he went 0-1 in 9 games, 7.24 ERA in 13.2 IP, 21 H, 11 ER, 8 BB, 10 K and a 2.12 WHIP. He spent most of the 2021 season with Gastonia as he went 4-8 in 14 starts, 7.26 ERA in 74.1 IP, 106 H, 60 ER, 31 BB, 62 K and 1.84 WHIP. Bivens signed his first minor league contract with the San Francisco Giants on May 16th, 2022 and was sent to Low-A San Jose, where he went 2-1 in 21 games, 2.70 ERA in 30 IP, 2 holds, 2-3 in saves, 20 H, 9 ER, 18 BB, 36 K, opposing batters hit .182 against him and a 1.27 WHIP.

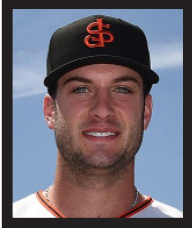

Junior (2020) Appeared in 18 games in the shortened 2020 season, making four appearances on the mound including three starts. Had three doubles, two triples and two homers, driving in 12 runs and scoring 11 times. Added three stolen bases on the season. Went 2-1 with a 2.41 ERA on the mound, striking out 23 in 18 2/3 innings. Opponents hit just .194 against him in 2020. Sophomore (2019) Appeared in 39 games as a sophomore, while making 21 appearances on the mound. Hit .257 with eight doubles, two triples, a homer, 10 RBI and 27 runs scored, adding six stolen bases. Went 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA and six saves on the mound. Ranked fifth in the SAC in saves. Struck out 28 in 23 2/3 innings with opponents hitting just .221 against him. Made his return to the diamond in mid-July with the ACL Giants Orange where he has since fired 12.1 innings over seven appearances with 20 strikeouts and just 4 walks. Finished the season with a combined 31 IP and a 4.35 ERA between the AZL and High-A West League. At Georgetown, transitioned from primarily working as a reliever in his sophomore (2018) season before pitching almost exclusively as a starter as a junior (2019). As a junior, Morreale went 4-5 in 15 APPs (11 starts) with a 4.63 ERA and a team-high 82 K's in 68.0 IP. His 82 K's were then the 5th most in single-season school history, and his 10.85 K/9 average ranked 2nd. Named to the Big East Honor Roll in his junior season. Attended high school at St. Thomas Academy, serving as a two-year starter and the team's captain during his senior season before spending a post graduate year at the IMG Academy. While at the IMG Academy, Morreale was named the team's best pitcher in 2016 after posting a 1.30 ERA and 79 K's in 50 IP. In his next year of action, he would see a tremendous increase in his numbers with the AZL Giants. He appeared in 14 games, started in eight, had a record of 7-1 with a 3.77 ERA, 57.1 IP, 60 hits, 29 R, 24 ER, 27 walk 53 strikeouts and the opposition is hitting .271. With the numbers he presented in 2019, he would be promoted to Low-A San Jose. His numbers would continue to improve with San Jose as he finished with a 4-2 record, 4.97 ERA in 31 games, six holds, one save in two opportunities, 50.2 IP, permitted 49 hits, 37 R, 28 ER, 13 walks, 66 strikeouts and .249 batting average against. Hough High School where he was named MECCA Conference pitcher of the year as a senior in 2017. Went 7-1 with a 0.80 ERA to earn all-state honors from the North Carolina Baseball Coaches Association. Struck out 74 in 52 1/3 innings. Set Hough HS career records for wins (24), strikeouts (235) and ERA (1.03). During his freshman year at NC State, he appeared in 20 games and posted a perfect 4-0 record to go along with a 3.52 ERA. Threw 30.2 innings and struck out 37 batters, while walking 18. Swiney yielded just 12 earned runs during the season and did not allow more than three in any appearance. Made 13 appearances out of the bullpen where he did not allow a run. In 2019 as a sophomore, he made 26 appearances, including three starts on the mound. Finished with a 7-1 record and a 4.61 ERA. His 26 appearances out of the bullpen were the second-most on the team. Led the team with 95 strikeouts in 56.2 innings pitched. Held an 11-inning stretch from April 13-27 where he did not allow a run to score. In 2020, as a junior, he collected Collegiate Baseball Second Team All-America honors to close out his career. Went 4-0 on the season in as many starts, leading all ACC pitchers in wins. Allowed just four earned runs in 28.0 innings for a 1.29 ERA. Tallied a team-high 42 strikeouts, which ranked 10th in the NCAA. Fanned a career-high 15 strikeouts on Feb. 29 vs. Purdue at the CambriaCollegeClassic, which were the most in a single game by an NC State pitcher since Carlos Rodon on April 25, 2014. Also went a career-long eight innings vs. Purdue. Named ACC Pitcher of the Week and Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week on March 2 after his dominant performance against Purdue. Held opponents to a .144 batting average, and allowed just five extra-base hits all season. In 2021, he split his time with the AZL Giants and the Low-A San Jose Giants pitching in 12 games total with a 0-0 record, 0.84 ERA in 32.1 IP, 18 BB, 58 K

Academic All-Big Ten in 2020. Father, Dave Weber, is familiar with being drafted as he was selected by the Los Angeles Raiders in the 11th round of the 1988 NFL Draft. Weber was drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the 34th round 1008th overall in 2016. During his time with Low-A San Jose, he pitched in 27 games, started in three games, pitched a 3-4 record in 54 IP, 4.50 ERA, 2 holds, 8 BB and 56 K. The opposition hit .286 against Weber. Helped lead the team to a state championship as a junior in 2014. He attended Grand Canyon Univ. where as a freshman in 2016, he split time between starting and relieving, going 2-3 with a 4.28 ERA. Appeared in relief for his first five games in a GCU uniform before making debut as a starter. In his first career start, he allowed just one earned run in 5.0 innings. As a sophomore, he made the jump from a mostly-bullpen role as a freshman to the team's Friday night starter and staff ace in 2017. Finished 5-3 with a 4.00 ERA in 78.2 innings. Was a two-time WAC Pitcher of the Week. Allowed one or no earned runs in five of his first seven starts of the season. At the season's mid-way point, had one of the top 20 ERAs in the nation, sitting at 1.38. In his final year with GCU, he earned All-WAC second team honors. Single-season rankings in GCU Division I history: 3rd in ERA (2.81), t-3rd in wins (9), t-2nd in strikeouts (89). Career rankings in GCU Division I history: 2nd in ERA (3.59), 4th in wins (16), 4th in innings pitched (223.0), 3rd in strikeouts (168). Finished third in the WAC in ERA (2.81) and t-3rd in wins (9). Finished season by setting new career strikeout record with 11 in GCU's opening game of the WAC Tournament against Seattle U. Did not allow an earned run in eight innings of work. As a 3rd Rd pick, he was GCU's highest draft pick since Tim Salmon (1989). Wong would start his pro career with then short season Salem Keizer starting in 11 games, posting a 0-2 record, 27.1 IP to a 2.30 ERA, allowing 28 hits, 8 R, 7 ER, 6 walks, 27 strikeouts and the opposition hitting .259. In 2019, he spend time with both full season Augusta and San Jose where he would start in 23 games, pitch to a 5-3 record, 113 IP to a 3.90 ERA, permit 102 hits, 56 R, 49 ER, 35 walks, 101 strikeouts and a .245 batting average against.

A two-way standout from the University of Connecticut who hit 13 homers as a first baseman and logged 7 2/3 innings on the mound, Crawford got the scouting industry excited in his left arm when he touched triple digits over the summer while pitching for USA Baseball. The thrill was dashed in the fall when the Huskies star hurt his elbow and required Tommy John surgery, which will keep him out for all of the 2022 season. It's hard to know exactly what Crawford is, other than big, strong and left-handed. The strength and power definitely showed up at the plate, but the southpaw's velocity points to a professional future on the mound once he's healthy. While with Team USA and during a quick stop in the Cape Cod League, his fastball averaged a tick over 97 mph and touched 100, showing an ability to throw it for a strike. In his brief mound time at UConn, he hadn't thrown much more than the heater, but he did show off a plus 84-85 mph slider that he also landed in the strike zone and missed bats with over the summer. While many teams don't shy away from amateur pitchers coming back from TJ surgery, the fact that Crawford has just eight official collegiate innings on his resume makes him even harder to evaluate. That said, this kind of arm strength from the left side doesn't grow on trees.

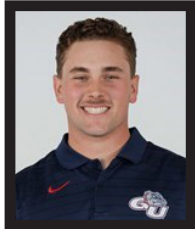

In 2021, he threw 62 IP, 3.77 ERA, 1.161 WHIP, 79 K and 22 BB. Whisenhunt was on the scouting radar as a North Carolina high schooler but went undrafted in 2019 because he lacked present stuff. He headed into 2022 as the best healthy college left-hander available but won't pitch in a college game after getting a yearlong suspension from the NCAA after testing positive for a performance-enhancing drug he said came from a supplement he bought at a national nutrition store chain. He still could give East Carolina a first-round pitcher for the second straight Draft, following Gavin Williams, and is similar to Kansas State southpaw Jordan Wicks, who went 21st overall to the Cubs last July. Like Wicks, Whisenhunt has one of the best changeups in his Draft, an 82-85 mph weapon that drops at the plate and generated a 59 percent swing-and-miss rate in 2021. He sets it up with a 91-95 mph fastball with the same arm speed, though his heater features more downhill plane than life and gets hit if he doesn't locate it well. While scouts rate his upper-70s curveball as average at best and he doesn't use it very much, it dodges more than its share of bats. Whisenhunt's classic pitcher's build, athleticism and delivery all endear him to evaluators. He shows some feel for working both sides of the plate with his fastball, and his control and command should continue to improve with more experience. A potential mid-rotation starter with a high floor, he showed he hadn't lost his stuff during a stint in the Cape Cod League this summer.

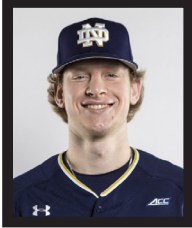

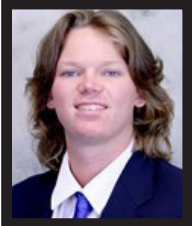

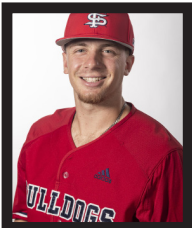
